JMPHS 2017-18 School Grade Overview

Each year the Florida Department of Education measures school performance using its Florida School Grades assessment calculation. The purpose of the school grade and its components is to provide a way for parents and the general public to understand "how well [the] school is serving its students."

In general, Florida public high schools are assessed on ten components:

- 1. Four Achievement Components comprised of student performance in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies state assessments
- 2. Four Learning Gains Components comprised of learning gains from current and prior year student performance on English Language Arts and Mathematics assessments

The following components are included only for high schools that had students enrolled in both 11th and 12th grades the prior year:

- 3. Graduation Rate comprised of a prior-year adjusted four-year graduation rate
- 4. College and Career Acceleration comprised of a percentage of prior-year graduates earning credit through dual enrollment courses, earned industry certifications, and acceleration exams (AP, IB, and AICE)

School Grading Scale: A = 62% of points or greater, B = 54% to 61% of points, C = 41% to 53% of points, D = 32% to 40% of points, F = 31% of points or under
